Watercolors: Warm and Cool for each of the primaries, plus 2 additional *earth tones* with (characteristics) ... Holbein, M. Graham or Winsor Newton Artist Grade are best

Red: Warm = Cadmium Red Light (opaque)

• *Cool* = **Alizarin Crimson** (transperent staining)

Yellow: *Warm* = **Cadmium Yellow Deep** (opaque)

• *Cool* = **Cadmium Yellow Light** (opaque)

Blue: *Warm* = **Cerulean Blue** (semi-opaque) or **Magnesium Blue**

• *Cool* = French **Ultramarine Blue** (transperant non-staining)

Earth tones:

- *Warm* = **Burnt Umber** (semi-opaque)
- *Cool* = **Indigo** (semi-transperant)

Brushes:

- Rounds: 3, 8 14 (Sables hold water better than synthetics)
- Flats: 10, 19
- 1 & 1/2" Flat wash synthetic

Paper:

• Arches (best) +/- 9 x 12 in. 140lb cold pressed, or similar

Palette

 Plasetic covered color wheel tray (for better color study), or butcher tray for free flow mixing

2 water containers

masking fluid

absorbant towel (absorbant paper towels/tissue paper optional)

Folding chair and/or light watercolor easel. Backpack/bag or dolly type materials box
